TOWN, PORT, & GARRISON.

On Monday, Mr. Walter Amos, of 54, Manor Wood, Maxton, fell 35 feet from a scaffold while working on the new Marine Station on the Admiralty Pier, but escaped with a slight injury to his neck and a slightly grazed arm. He was conveyed to the Dover Hospital and detained.

Sergt-Major Charles Arthur Figg, brother to ex-Sergent Figg, Dover Police, has just received a commission in the R.A.F.C. as an old St. James's schoolboy, and was at one time in the employ of Dr. Colbeck. He is with the Expeditionary Force. During the South African War he was with the Field Hospital, and was at the siege of Ladysmith, returning to England two years later.

Garrison Sergt-Major A. W. Lloyd, now at Dublin, has been appointed Quarter-Master of the Buffs, with the rank of Honorary Lieutenant.

There was a large audience at the concert at the Town Hall on Saturday afternoon, when, included in an excellent programme, Mr. H. J. Taylor played "The W. W. Saylor's 'White Lion' March," which was first played at the Dover public meeting of the League earlier in the year. It is a fine composition, at times stirring and at times impressive and solemn. The vocal parts of the programme consisted of patriotic songs daily sung by Mr. George du Val.

The Rev. W. H. Gregory preached his farewell sermon at Backland Wesleyan Church on Sunday evening. He will be succeeded by the Rev. H. Hopkins, whose consecration ceremony will take place on September 13th, at the Wesley Hall.

Recruiting meetings were held every evening in the Market Square by the following veterans of over twenty-one years' service:—Messrs. Barnett, Griffin, Allwork, Baynes, Easter and Davis.

The usual meeting of the Dover and District Amalgamated Self-Help Club Protection League was held at "The Grapes," Winchester, on Thursday, 27th. The following were present:—Bro. King (Chairman), Messrs. Taylor ("White Lion"), Russ (Secy.), Taylor ("Grapes"), Parry and Miller (of "The Grapes"), and E. Fisher (of the "Granville"), who acted as Secretary owing to the Secretary being unable to attend. The next meeting will be held at the "Gate" on Thursday, September 3rd, at 8 p.m.

Miss Kathleen Downs will be the vocalist at the organ recital in the Town Hall this Saturday afternoon, at 7.30.

A fatal accident through being run over by the street by a motor car occurred in Toronto about a fortnight ago in George Wickens, aged 32 years, who, with his mother and her three younger children, had only arrived two weeks previously in Canada from 9, Longfield Cottages, Dover. They had come to join Mr. Wickens, who had left about three months previously. The driver of the motor car was detained by the police, as is customary in all cases of this nature in Canada.

Mr. F. J. Kennell, eldest son of Mr. J. Kennell, for many years in business as a builder in Dover, has gone on a visit to Dover for the past month from Toronto, Canada, where he has been for some years past.

The funeral took place at St. Mary's Cemetery on Sunday morning last, of Mrs. Clara Jane Dennis, wife of Mr. Thomas Samuel Dennis, late Trinity pilot, of Dover, whose death occurred on Sunday, August 17th, at the age of 82 years. The Rev. C. Watkinson was the officiating clergyman. There were a number of beautiful floral tributes. Mr. E. J. Goodwin carried out the funeral arrangements.

The funeral took place at St. James's Cemetery on Tuesday of Miss Helen Eggleston, the eldest lady of Corpus Christi Convent, Royal West Kent Regiment, and Mrs. Eggleston, of 128, Clarendon Place, whose death occurred at the Dover Infectious Hospital on Sunday.

NOTA BENE.

The War.

The British Forces fighting on the left flank of the French Army were in action near the Belgian town of Mosa on Sunday and Monday for thirty-six hours, during which they were six times subjected to desperate attacks by superior German forces. They held their ground with great coolness, and beat off every attack, the steady shooting of our soldiers, it is stated by French officers, being very fine. The British troops, however, on Monday had to fall back to a line on the French frontier as a result of the pressure on the French front. This retirement was safely accomplished, but our total losses are said to be over two thousand. Of the details of this great fight—the greatest since the Crimea—we know so little. The gallantry of our troops in their first great test for sixty years against European troops, however, is acknowledged. Generally, the war on the French frontier, while not altogether satisfactory to us, is by no means discouraging. The French and our troops have been attacked by superior forces, and although slightly forced back, they have not been pierced, and nothing is any way resembling the debacle of 1870 has been experienced. This is the essence of the problem, for so long as the French, British and Belgian hold the Germans more or less on the Western frontier of Germany, the Russians, with their Army of millions, are rapidly advancing in Eastern Russia. Already the Germans are in full retreat there, and the Western frontier will have to be depleted if the Kaiser has any idea of attempting to hold his own on his Eastern frontier. If another British Army Corps could be sent to assist the French, it would be most excellent, more, and it is to be hoped it is being done. In those times when
